# Holy Week

Holy Week is considered the most important time of the year for Catholics, as it commemorates the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. At OLV, we will celebrate Holy Week during Week 11.

What is Holy Week? Holy Week is the final week of Lent, the 40-day period of preparation for Easter, and begins on Palm Sunday, commemorating Jesus' entry into Jerusalem.

Why is it important? Holy Week is a time of reflection and prayer. It's a time when Catholics remember and participate in events leading

up to Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection.

#### **Key Days:**

- Palm Sunday: Commemorates Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem.
- Maundy Thursday: Marks the Last Supper, Judas' betrayal, and Jesus' arrest.
- Good Friday: Commemorates Jesus' trial, sentence of death, crucifixion, and burial. This is also recognised as the Stations of the Cross.
- Holy Saturday: Concludes the Triduum of Holy Week with a late-night Easter Vigil service.

**The Triduum:** The three days from Holy (Maundy) Thursday evening to Easter Sunday evening are known as the Triduum, a period of reflection and prayer.

Easter Sunday: The celebration of Jesus' resurrection, marking the end of Holy Week and the beginning of the Easter season.

**Significance:** Holy Week is a time to focus on the core of the Christian faith – the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ – and to renew one's faith and commitment to following Him.

## Easter Eggs and Easter Celebrations

Unfortunately for us, we have not celebrated the Resurrection of Jesus during this term so therefore, in tying into both religious symbolism and tradition:-

We will not give Easter eggs out this week because Easter eggs are a symbol of new life and the Resurrection of Jesus. It emphasises the joyous celebration of Christ's victory – the risen Jesus. In Catholic tradition, Lent (the 40 days before Easter) is a time of fasting, prayer, and reflection. It's more solemn, especially during Holy Week, which remembers Jesus' suffering and death.

Giving out Easter eggs before Easter would be like celebrating the victory before the story reaches its climax. Since the Resurrection hasn't happened yet in the liturgical timeline, it's appropriate to wait. Once Easter Sunday hits that's when the celebration begins!

In short: staff will not be giving out eggs before Easter staying true to the spiritual flow of our Catholic story.

It might be something you would like to explain to your child/ren why we (as a Catholic school) don't give out eggs before the resurrection (Easter Sunday). The hollow egg represents the empty tomb - He's alive!

You will notice (if in attendance), the Resurrection has been excluded from Thursday's Easter Liturgy (2EH) 10/4 at 9.10am because Jesus hasn't risen yet. The Resurrection will be celebrated next term as part of our on-going Easter theme and Pentecost unit of work.

Thank you for your understanding and commitment towards our Catholic tradition and school ethos.


